



EXTRA-CURRICULAR

The History trip to Ypres enables students to understand the important role of British soldiers during WWI and to put the war in the context of both British and Jewish history.

An extraordinary, informative and popular Poland trip in the sixth form gives our students the chance to explore and understand how the destruction of European and World Jewry took place during the Holocaust.

Visits from army personnel enable our students to explore what life in military armies is like and what it means to defend the civil liberties and rights of individuals. Various talks and activities give our students the opportunity to understand what it means to be in an army.

Anti-bullying and anti-racism week widens the horizons of our students by introducing the concepts of bullying and racism and the impact they can have on victims. The school works alongside agencies such as Streetwise to facilitate activities and seminars.

Yoni Jesner and eVolve awards provide opportunities for our students to build their own portfolio of volunteering hours. Students have helped out in old age peoples' homes, helped make food for the homeless and have coached younger children in various sports.

Political hustings organised in the run up to elections give our sixth formers, many of whom are eligible to vote, the chance to hear from their local candidates about local and national matters. For example, in the run-up to the 2015 General Election, five of the candidates standing in Finchley & Golders Green visited the school to outline their aims.



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Mental Health awareness, in association with JAMI, enable our students to better understand mental health issues in young boys and girls and how such issues should be reported and dealt with.

Educational visits to the Houses of Parliament give students the opportunity to understand the British parliament system as the political and legal systems used in the United Kingdom.

Charity fairs bring our students together to have days of fun, whilst also raising tens of thousands of pounds for various charities each year.

Daily prayers provide students with the chance to reflect on their ethics, attitude, value and religious practice.

Students have the opportunity to work with our partner school, Islamia College, to explore inter-faith issues. Our students have visited the school during Ramadan and benefited from visits during Holocaust Memorial Day. Lessons also take place about other faiths, including Christianity and Islam, giving our students an understanding of different faiths within the United Kingdom.

British Values sessions during form time allow students to gain an understanding of various aspects of British democracy, including voting rights and election methods, acceptance and tolerance of people of different faith, gender and sexuality and the rights and responsibilities that young people have in the United Kingdom.
