### **Empowered Females in STEM Competition – Yr 12 Girls Google/Intel.**

We were delighted that Yr 12 girls Ariella Goldstein and Tamar Kander were accepted onto the Empower Females in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) programme run by Upskill me. The Hasmonean girls were accepted from over 600 applications to join the winners from other schools to attend the programme, which mean they attended the Ada Lovelace launch day in October, as well as a series of masterclasses in succeeding in STEM-related careers. The girls were please to attend the final celebratory event of this programme in March at the Institute of Engineering and Science at Savoy Place, London. The event was a further opportunity for the girls to display their STEM skills as they engaged in a panel discussion with female STEM professionals.

## Year 13 Boys and Girls Careers Interviews

This term, we have started the comprehensive round of Careers Interviews with the Yr 13 pupils – the interviews, which fulfils Hasmonian’s requirements to provide unbiased careers advice to our 6<sup>th</sup> form learners, will discuss the A-Level & Btec choices pupils are taking, their post-18 university and employment choices as well as how they are developing the skills to progress in their future careers choices. Yr 13s have been completing online careers questionnaires on the dedicated Google Careers Classroom to get them thinking about the careers choices after their sem and yeshiva year(s). The majority of pupils have made decisions about their university choices and were pleased to discuss the grade and entry requirements with the team of Hasmonian interviewers – the interview process will continue throughout the year, working to inform the Yr 13s along with the additional careers programme activities run for the 6<sup>th</sup> form this year.



## Yr 9 Girls Natwest Careers Sense Workshop

The Yr 9 girls were fortunate to spend an afternoon in November working with NatWest Bank on their Career Sense workshop – the programme helped the girls work on their employment skills and the Yr 9s were challenged to think about their careers choices by the online speaker. The programme also worked on the girls’ entrepreneurial skills in working within a financial environment.

## Yr 12 and 13 University Grades

Hasmonean has updated its database of entry A-Level and Btec grades required for degree courses across many of the London and countrywide universities favoured by our 6<sup>th</sup> formers. The database includes many of the academic course requirements from London's UCL, Queen Mary and Kings universities as well as itemised A-Level grades required by Nottingham, Leeds, Bristol universities. This year's database also has an upgrade to the Oxbridge grades required by Oxford and Cambridge colleges for many of their courses. The database should be a useful and easily understood user-friendly for 6<sup>th</sup> formers to quickly make comparisons of the grade entry criteria required for popular courses including Law, Psychology and Economics. The database also includes many of the grades required for entry to vocational courses and specialised degrees offered by Arts and Music colleges and those not included in the Russell Group list of universities in London. We will find this database will act as a useful complement to the Unifrog and other grade comparison websites.
