Monday 3rd July – Friday 7th July



Before you go:

- Check where the placement is head office or branch.
- Work out your route bus or tube, lift, walking?
- Who do you report to who will be you supervisor?
- What is your start time & when do you have to be there
 - will this be the same everyday?
- What is the dress code?
- Will lunch be available?



On the first day - Monday

- Ask for an induction meeting or talk health & safety.
- Expect to be shown round the offices/departments.
- Expect to be introduced to staff and colleagues.
- Ask questions be proactive. Expect different tasks
- See if you can discuss a schedule for the week.
- Tell your supervisor what you want out of the placement.

During your placement

- Ask to do a variety of tasks (meetings, site visits, working with customers, handing money/transactions, computing work).
- If you are doing dull, repetitive work all day(filing/photocopying/making tea) then discuss this with your supervisor.
- Recall what skills you are learning reflect on whether this is going to be a career choice.
- Report any injuries to the employer along with workplace guidance



Things not to do...

- Chat with friends or use your mobile phone when working (main thing employers complain about).
- Miss a day without informing employer (illness call in and inform employer).
- Leave you placement without permission – talk to parents, employer and school if placement is unsuitable.
- Be rude to customers.
- Ask for payment you may get paid but don't expect it.



If you have a problem

- Injuries write it in the accident log-book at work.
- Being exploited/bullied complain to supervisor and school
- Employer or you changes mind about placement don't stay at home - phone school or organise another placement.



Will school staff visit you?

 NO – they will phone your employer and have a telephone conversation with you and your supervisor at some time during the week and a survey done with the employer that we will send to you in Sept.
